

Rav Mordechai Fleisher Appointed Rav of Zera Abraham

After fifteen years with the Denver Community *Kollel*, Rabbi Mordechai and Devorah Fleisher have taken the position of *Rov* and *Rebbetzin* of Congregation *Zera Abraham* of West Denver. The Fleishers moved to Denver to join the *Kollel* in August of 2007.

After 3 years as a full-time Kollel Scholar, Rabbi Fleisher was installed as Director of Community Education in 2011. In that capacity, he continued making a great impact upon the community through his popular classes (and creative class titles). In the following years, the *Kollel* and community greatly benefited from R' Mordechai's multi-faceted talents as Rabbi Fleisher played a number of roles within the *Kollel*, wearing a variety of

He was a vital part of the leadership team that led the Kollel as it emerged from the Great Recession to achieve BH new heights of success, including the increase of the number of the core *Kollel* Scholars to ten, the development and growth of the Southeast *Kollel Torah* Center, and the construction of the West Denver *Kollel Torah*

New Space for Southeast Envisioned

It is a quarter century since Rabbi Yaakov Meyer of Aish-Denver first invited the *Kollel* to partner with him by teaching *Torah* in the Southeast Denver community. Throughout the next decades, the Southeast community has seen phenomenal growth, both physically and spiritually. Major milestones in that growth were the settling the first two *Kollel* families Southeast over 15 years ago, and the opening of the *Kollel's* own Southeast *Bais Medrash* six years ago. Since opening its doors, the Southeast *Kollel* Torah Center/*Ohel Yissochor* has become a hub of *Torah* study for the entire community. With the continued growth of the community, the current space has become inadequate and the need for creating a larger space has

become clear. An opportunity arose about two years ago when the house next door to the current Southeast *Kollel Torah* Center went up for sale. The *Kollel* purchased the property for the purpose of enlarging the *Kollel Torah* Center, and efforts began to create plans for a new, spacious *Kollel Torah* Center. Now, those plans are complete, tenderings have been drawn, and a campaign to



aise the necessary funds is being launched. The plans for the new Torah Center include an

Center. For the past several years, Rabbi Fleisher was the Kollel's Senior Educator, delivering classes on a variety of Torah topics, including the long-running Torah for Tycoons program. In 2013, he, along with Mrs. Joyce Litzman, launched the M.B. Glassman Foundation GOLD Senior Division, an endeavor which he led until his departure. "I have an enormous amount of hakaras hatov to the Kollel, to the *Roshei Kollel* Rabbi Schwab and Rabbi Sommers, as well as to Kollel Director Rabbi Heyman, for all they have done for me, my wife and my family during these past fifteen years in providing opportunities for our growth in so many ways, and in helping us reach this exciting point in our lives," says Rabbi Fleisher. "I look forward to working together with them and the other community institutions as well as the wonderful and talented individuals in our community, to grow our *shul* and our community, to create new and innovative approaches for the challenges we face today, and to build a bright future for Congregation Zera Abraham and, by extension, for the entire Denver Jewish community.

Much as the Torah has been the anchor of the Jewish Nation throughout its history, the *Kollel's* hallmark of *Torah* excellence has remained a steadfast anchor through thick and thin, allowing the *Kollel* to weather shifting demographics, recessions and pandemics. "We greatly appreciate the continued, dedicated support of our donors, who recognize the value of the *Torah* study these Scholars bring to Denver and make this pay raise possible."
